Yard Waste Dumpster Specifics:

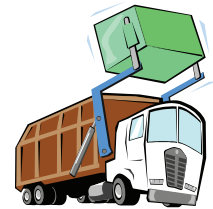
WHO: The dumpster is free to dues-paying homeowners or pay \$50.

911—WHEN SHOULD I CALL?

The Snohomish County Sheriff's office recommends calling 911 in the following situations:

- Fire,
- Life threatening emergencies such as stroke, heart attack, serious falls, heavily bleeding cuts, or unconsciousness,
- Assault or burglary,
- Mail theft,
- Strangers in the area or solicitors (may be casing the area for robbery),
- Car break-ins and theft,
- Dumping waste,
- Graffiti on cars, signs, buildings, or on the street,
- Loose dogs and barking dogs,
- Unsupervised teen parties.

Why call 911 on all of these things? First, the dispatcher will direct your call to the appropriate place, so do not worry if the call is not an emergency. Second, calling 911 makes sure there is a record of the incident. Too many times people do not call because they think the issue is too small and may be a mistake. There may be a pattern to the small issues which the police will not be able to establish unless there is a record of a call. So no issue is too small to call. Your safety is very important and we all must participate in protecting ourselves and our neighbors.

The Snohomish County Sheriff's Office also encourages residents to set up Block Watches within Wingate. A Block watch group should be immediate neighbors and a group of no more than 10 homes. Our short streets and cul-de-sacs make excellent groupings. If you want to learn more, call 425-744-6868 and request a Block Watch Packet. The packet will contain instructions on setting up your own Block Watch group
